



Bachelor of Arts (Architecture)

The B.A. Architecture programme is a four-year undergraduate honours programme that prepares graduates for architectural design, construction and allied professions in the global context.

The programme focuses on architectural studies, with design as the central core discipline. Design projects are exploratory and grounded in cultural, environmental and heritage concerns which aim to address the increasing need for graduates to practise outside Singapore and be sensitive to varied cultural contexts.

Students have the opportunity to enhance their academic experience and cultural exposure through the extensive student exchange programmes with leading architecture schools, overseas field trips, joint studios with overseas architecture schools or institutes and design workshops conducted abroad.

Graduates who fulfill the required academic criteria will then proceed directly to the one-year Master of Architecture programme within the framework of a five-year concurrent professional degree programme. The Bachelor and Master of Architecture programmes are accredited by the Board of Architects, Singapore and the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA).
