Abstract

As Building Information Modelling (“BIM”) becomes commonplace in the Singapore construction industry, the legal issues which arise from the use of BIM will become significant. These impact on risks and pricing. Steps have been taken by industry players to consider the legal issues and to try to allocate the associated risks. The product of these steps is a recommended set of particular conditions of contract, namely, the BIM Particular Conditions. The speaker will seek to outline the legal issues and discuss the various concerns and solutions to risk allocation which find material form in the BIM Particular Conditions. The issues associated with use of the BIM Particular Conditions will also be discussed.

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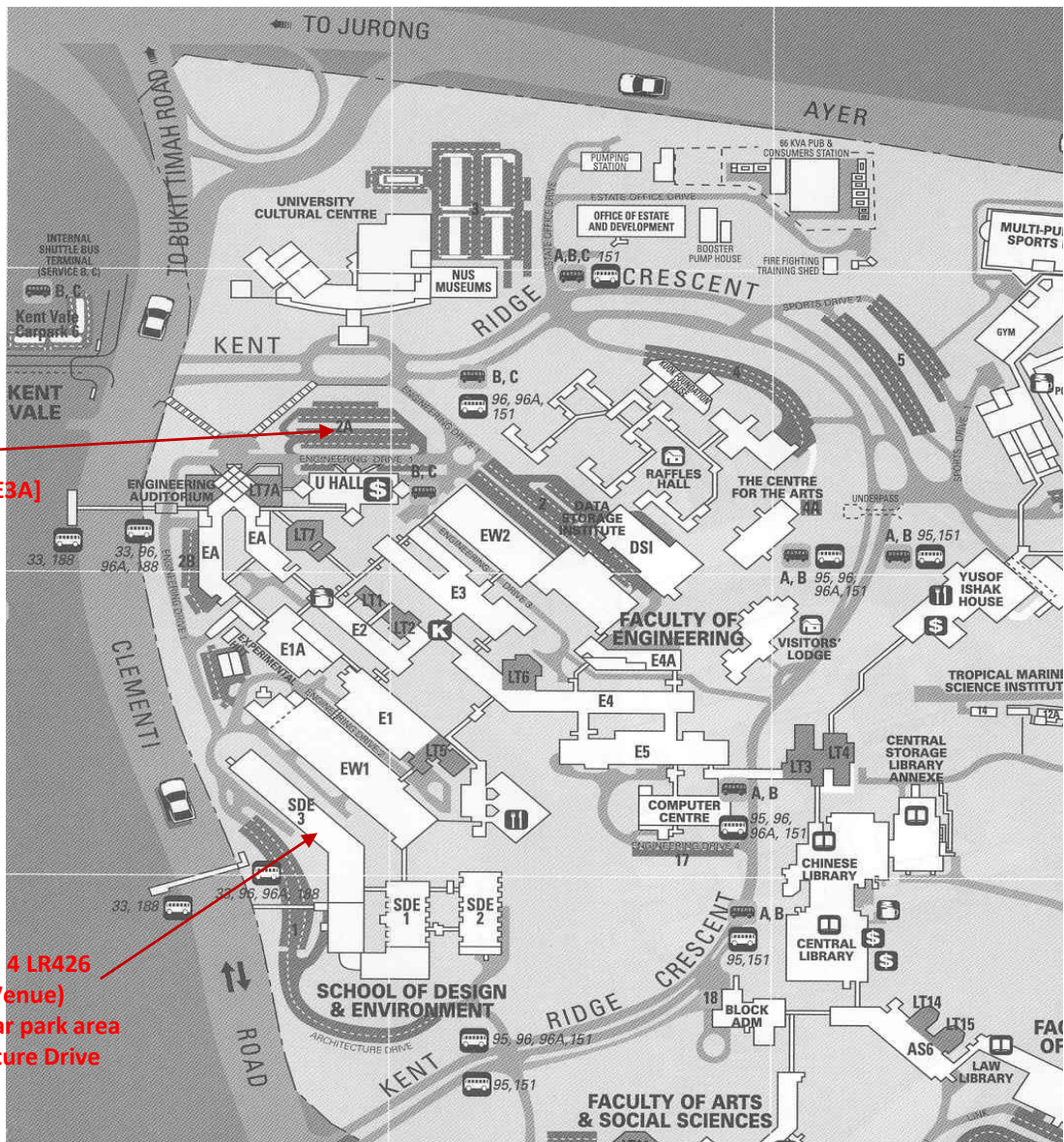
